Sakaide City would like to show you how they make use of their regional characteristics in manufacturing and agricultural industries and how they work on human resources and community development. They would also like to

discuss about how Australia and New Zealand utilise their rich resources for Tourism purposes.

Since they are also facing a decreasing population, Sakaide would also like to hear your opinions on multicultural societies.

Location:

Approximately 53,700 (As of 1 June 2014)

Sakaide City is located in the north of the Shikoku island. It takes approximately 4 hours by a bullet train and an express train from Tokyo, or approximately 1.5 hours flight from Tokyo to Takamatsu airport (from Takamatsu to Sakaide is about 40 minute drive).

Famous for:

Udon Noodle



Udon noodle is one of the soul food for Japanese people. There are several factories producing Udon in Sakaide, some of

which let visitors make and prepare their own noodles!

> Agricultural Products

Kintoki-mikan is one kind of Satsuma-mandarin. They are characterized by their high sugar content and sweetness. They are carefully sorted by their looks, size and sugar content before being shipped. Luckily late November, when the seminar is held, is the best season. You will have the opportunity to pick Kintoki-mikan and to try them! Sakaide is also famous for Kintoki-imo (sweet potato) and Kintoki-ninjin (carrot).

> Seto-Ohashi Bridge

Seto-ohashi Bridge connects Honshu Island, the main island of Japan, and Shikoku Island. On the Seto Inland Sea, there are countless beautiful islands which are described as the "Jewels of the World".



Historical Places

There are many historical places to visit in Sakaide. Recently the Shikoku Pilgrimage, which is a multisite pilgrimage of 88 temples on Shikoku Island has become very popular. It is said that the Pilgrimage was established in the 17th century and Sakaide has two of the temples.
