


Introducing our new Assistant Directors!

I look forward to meeting all of you!



My career began in 2016 at the Tokyo Metropolitan Board of Education (BOE), where I contributed to initiatives aimed at developing globally competent human resources. I was in charge of the Japan Exchange and Teaching (JET) Programme, which invites young college graduates worldwide to participate in internationalisation initiatives and engage in foreign language education at various educational institutions and government offices in Japan. I oversaw administrative tasks related to personnel affairs for over 400 JET participants assigned to Tokyo metropolitan schools.

After working for three years at the Tokyo BOE, I transitioned to the International Affairs Division of the Tokyo Metropolitan Government. Here, our focus is on promoting city diplomacy through exchanges with cities worldwide to establish Tokyo as a global metropolis. As this year marks the 40th anniversary of the Friendship State Relationship between the Metropolis of Tokyo and the State of New South Wales, I look forward to further strengthening our partnership through my role at CLAIR.
